In this project 75 villages are fully submerged and 137 villages including Harsud town is to be partially affected.

Award of all 212 villages in old FRL, 3 villages in TAPU, 79 villages in FRL to MWL, 88 villages in Revised FRL and 26 villages in Revised BWL have been passed.

#### **Payment position of compensation :-**

Till date an amount of Rs. 75857 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 22379 lacs as SRG, Rs. 24317 lacs as RG & TG in old FRL.

And an amount of Rs. 264.61 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 0.01 lacs as SRG, Rs. 25.17 lacs as RG & TG in TAPU.

And an amount of Rs. 1009 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 346 lacs as RG & TG in Harsud ward No- 9, 12 & 13,

And an amount of Rs. 3235 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 5.00 lacs as SRG, Rs 858 lacs as RG & TG in FRL to MWL & Back water,

And an amount of Rs. 2101.58 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 641 lacs as SRG, Rs 163.92 lacs as RG & TG in Revised FRL,

And an amount of Rs. 799.83 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 4.41 lacs as SRG, Rs 28.15 lacs as RG & TG in BWL has already been paid to the PAF's.

For resettlement of project affected families 34 R&R sites have been selected and all 34 sites are fully developed.

1938 plots allotted to project affected families at resettlement site.

Award of all 27 villages in old FRL, 7 villages in TAPU, 13 villages in revised FRL and 20 villages in revised BWL have been passed and affected area is 3310.959 Hec. Of land has been acquired. Out of 5814 Project affected families. 3195 families have been resettled.

In this project 6525.72 lacs as compensation amount, 1569.80 lacs as SRG, 2052.07 lacs as RG, 145.40 lacs as TG in old FRL,

And amount 502.68 lacs as compensation amount, 193.90 lacs as SRG, 2052.07 lacs in Revised FRL,

And an amount of Rs. 510.56 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 1.60 lacs as SRG, Rs. 491.30 lacs as RG & 41.25 as TG in BWL,

And an amount of Rs. 716.68 lacs as compensation amount, Rs. 195.06 lacs as SRG, 15.81 lacs as RG & 0.90 lacs as TG in TARU have already been paid to the PAFs.

For settlement of project affected families 10 R&R sites have been selected and all 10 sites are developed. 1390 plots allotted to project affected families at resettlement site.

## **Sardar Sarovar Project**

Sardar Sarovar Project is an Inter State Project in which four riparian States are involved & Madhya Pradesh is just one of them. The whole gamut of R&R is governed by the provisions of Narmada Water Disputes Tribunal; (NWDT) Award and R&R Policy of the State Govt. The coordinating Agency for these States is Narmada Control Authority (NCA) which is a statutory body having been constituted under NWDT Award and similarly, the R&R Sub-group is an institution established under Narmada Water Scheme. These institutions are empowered to take decision in regard to the process of R&R to be adopted by the States for the PAFs of SSP and such decisions taken by them have the legal force.

### **Supreme Court Directions Dated 18.10.2000 for SSP**

Construction of the dam will continue as per the Award of the Tribunal.

- Further raising of the height will be only pari passu with the implementation of the relief and rehabilitation and on the clearance by the Relief and Rehabilitation Sub-group. The Relief and Rehabilitation Sub-Group will give clearance of further construction after consulting the Grievance Redressal Authorities.
- The permission to raise the dam height beyond 90 meters will be given by the Narmada Control Authority from time to time, after it obtains the above-mentioned clearances from the Relief and Rehabilitation Sub-group and the Environment Sub-group.
- If for any reason differences in implementation of the Award arise and the same cannot be resolved in the Review Committee, the committee may refer the same to the prime Minister whose decision, in respect there of shall be final and binding on all concerned.
- Every endeavour shall be made to see that the project is completed as expeditiously as possible.

### **Directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 15.3.05 in WP(C) 328/2002 for SSP:-**

- All the applicants who were both permanently and temporarily affected by submergence, by reason of raising of the height of the dam to the present height would be entitled to the benefit of the rehabilitation package.
- Even where a major son belonging to PAF did not possess land separately he would be entitled to grant of a separate holding of 2 hect. land

## **Report of the Sardar Sarovar Project Relief and Rehabilitation Oversight group**

In the light of the observations of the Supreme Court in its order dated 17th April 2006, the Prime Minister constituted the Sardar Sarovar Project Relief & rehabilitation Oversight Group (OSG) under the Chairmanship of Shri V.K. Shunglu, former Controller and Auditor General of India with Prof. G.K. Chandha, former Vice Chancellor, Jawaharlal Nehru University and Dr. Jaiprakash Narayan, Convener, Loksatta as members. The mandate of the Group was "to verify the status of the rehabilitation in Madhya Pradesh of the families affected by the raising of the height of the Sardar Sarovar Dam from Elevation Level (EL) 110.64 mtrs to EL 121.92 mtrs".

The Oversight Group's report on the status of rehabilitation in Madhya Pradesh of the PAF was submitted to the Prime Minister through the Ministry of Water Resource on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2006 .

### **Recommendations of the Report of Over Sight Group regarding SSP.**

4.11 (a) An action plan should be prepared for 37 sites classified as good. This plan should be based on 100 per cent survey of PAFs assigned to these sites and should spell out dates by which current habitation will be vacated and new sites occupied. Based on provision of services, health and education, electricity connections etc., NCA may monitor shifting of PAFs to resettlement sites. NCA would need to be considerably strengthened to do so.

**Compliance on the Recommendation of Over Sight Group- An Action plan for shifting of the PAFs on 37 Good R&R Sites was submitted to NCA on 26/09/06. Distt. Administration has been given the responsibility of shifting of the PAFs and guidelines were given vide Orders dated 09 / 10 /06 and 11 / 10 / 06 regarding constitution of Village Level Rehabilitation Committee and Distt. Level Rehabilitation Committees respectively.**

( b ) A programme of up-gradation of all sites classified as Average or Poor and of seven sites reserved for PAFs between Dam height 121.92 mtrs. and 138 mtrs needs to be drawn up. A connected issue relates to 4404 PAFs who were entitled to land for land, who opted for SRP and from amongst whom nearly 4190 have purchased land of their choice. Land purchases at places of their choice may well preclude many of them from setting at the R&R sites assigned to them. Increase in number of PAFs accepting cash instead of resettlement supports this and should be taken into account.

**Compliance -Proposal-The upgradation work for R&R Sites has already been completed. Out of 4404 PAFs eligible for Land allotment, 2696 PAFs have purchased 5914.39 Ha. of agricultural land against their 1874.30 Ha. submerged land as indicated in Table'B' . ( As on 16/11/07 )**

( c ) About 4751 claims were forwarded by GRA to NVDA for verification and settlement. While some of these have already been disposed of, the number is not very large. NVDA under the superintendence of GRA would therefore be required to dispose of all claims before arriving at a final list of PAFs.

**Compliance -Out of 4751 cases of GRA 3640 (91%) cases have been resolved. ( As on 16/11/07 )**

(d) Supreme Court had directed that major sons would also be entitled to land where the PAFs are entitled to land. NVDA should confirm to NCA that this exercise has been completed even in respect of major sons whose cases were rejected earlier in view of a different interpretation.

**Compliance -In compliance to the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 15<sup>th</sup> March' 2005 all Major Sons of eligible PAFs were already included in the Action Taken Report. Therefore no Major Son was deprived of this benefit.**

(e) All functions in relation to SSP in M.P. are to date performed by NVDA. The District Administration has played at best a supportive role. Considering the kind of field work required and the time available it may be desirable for the district administration to be more directly involved in planning and implementation of the several actions required for securing compliance with NWDT award and Supreme Court directions. The modus vivendi is within the competence of GOMP.

**Compliance -To involve Distt. Administration in R&R of PAFs, directions have been issued vide NVDD's order dated 01 / 08 / 06.**

(f) GOMP should, within two months prepare a plan of action, assign mile stones, secure approval of R&R Sub-Group and commence action for resettlement of PAFs upto FRL.

**Compliance -The Action Plan of R&R at FRL has been submitted to Narmada Control Authority on 25 / 09 / 06.**

(g) Monitoring to secure compliance should remain the responsibility of NCA. NCA would certainly need considerable support. The kind of support, which became available to OSG was clearly predicated on an extraordinary situation which required NSSO to achieve deadlines by diverting staff from other projects. Ministry of Water Resources needs to evolve mechanisms to provide adequate professional support to NCA to discharge its obligations.

**Compliance -It relates to Narmada Control Authority .**

## **Present Status of R&R of Sardar Sarovar Project-**

In Sardar Sarovar Project, the main target was to resettle the PAFs affected at dam height 121.92 m. The land acquisition awards of all 177 villages affected at this dam height have been passed. Out of 28795 affected families, 24421 families have been extended the benefit of rehabilitation package and the entitlement of 4374 families has been rejected due to some or the other reasons.

The provision of Special Rehabilitation Package has already been endorsed by Shunglu Committee. 4190 PAFs who were eligible for allotment of land at dam height EL 121.92 m., had opted SRP for their rehabilitation. Out of which 2696 PAFs have purchased agricultural land admeasuring 5914.394 ha. in lieu of their 1874.300 ha. of acquired land.

All the PAFs at dam height of 121.92 m. have been extended R&R Package as per the norms of NWDT Award and R&R Policy of the State as indicated in Table 'A'. 87 R&R sites have been fully developed for the affected families of this project.

The balance work of rehabilitation is targeted to be completed in stipulated time despite the interference of Narmada Bachao Andolan which hampers the progress of R&R.

### **Updated information regarding Man Project:-**

Man is a completed project in which 993 families (including major sons) of 17 villages have been affected at FRL 297.65 m. The land acquisition awards of all 17 villages have been passed. Total amount of Rs.401.36 lacs as land acquisition award has been paid to the PAFs. The PAFs have been resettled in 4 developed R&R sites. 239 PAFs have been allotted residential plot, rest have opted for grants in lieu of residential plot and are settling at the place of their own choice. Out of 448 PAFs entitle for land for land, 62 have been allotted agricultural land and balance families are opted for special rehabilitation package in lieu of land. These 339 PAF have taken the amount of Rs. 615.67 lacs as special rehabilitation grant and have purchased 596.964 has. of agricultural land.

### **Updated information regarding Jobat Project:-**

In Jobat project 2019 families (including major sons) of 13 villages are affected at FRL 260.17 m. The rehabilitation of all 2019 affected families have been completed. The land acquisition awards of all 13 villages have been passed and Rs. 1017.82 lacs have been paid as compensation to the PAFs. The affected families are resettled in 2 R&R sites.

### **Updated information regarding Upper Beda Project:-**

In Upper Beda Project 14 villages have been affected at FRL 317 m. Out of this 13 villages will be affected partially and 1 village will be fully submerged. The R&R plan of this project have been already prepared. 16 land acquisition cases of 14 villages have to be passed, out of this 14 land acquisition cases have already been passed and action for the balance cases is in pipeline. The action plan for resettlement of all 577 families has been prepared out of which 127 families are resettled and rest is being under process.

**Conclusions- The R&R Plans of Upper Narmada in Mandla District, Halon in Dindori District are approval by Gant of India. The R&R plan of Lower Goi in Barwani District is in pipeline for it's approval with Govt. of India, Ministry of Tribal Affairs. The R&R Plan of Hoshangabad, Handia & Boras are in planning stage. Narmada Valley Development Authority is committed to rehabilitate the PAFs and extend them all their due rights and privileges as per the provisions of the Policy in all the other projects and as per NWDT Award in case of SSP. Continues monitoring and all out efforts are being made in this regard.**
